 Jewish scholars refer to the Old Testament as the TENACH:

- Tenach is an acronym for 3 Hebrew words:
- ◆ 1. <u>Torah</u>- The Law: the teaching & instructions of God.
- ◆ 2. <u>Nevi'im</u>: The Prophets
- ◆ 3. <u>Ketuvim</u>: The Writings

THE THREE MAJOR DIVISIONS OF THE FOUNDATIONAL BOOKS

- I. Formation (From creation to the Promised land):
 Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers,
 Deuteronomy (TORAH)
- II. The Monarchy (The United & Divided Kingdoms):

 I & II Samuel---United Monarchy

 I & II Kings---Divided Monarchy
- III. Post Exilic (following Babylonian Exile): Ezra & Nehemiah

THE TORAH CONSISTS OF FIVE BOOKS:

- 1. Genesis: the word itself means "the beginnings.
- 2. Exodus: describes the birth of a nation.
- 3. Leviticus: details the laws given to that nation
- 4. Numbers: tracks the wanderings in the wilderness.
- 5. <u>Deuteronomy</u>: a review of the laws; Jesus quoted from this book the most during His earthly ministry.

 as it always has


















The Valley of Jezreel


